Therapeutic Early Childhood Education Services

As an Illinois State Board of Education-approved early childhood program, in 2024, the Little Dreamers therapeutic school served 39 children, ages 3-9. Students in this program require more time and individualized attention to excel in the general education setting. With a teacher to pupil ratio of 3:1, our primary goal is to support children in transitioning to the least restrictive learning environment. In 2024, 90% of students who exited or aged out of this program moved to less restrictive environments. **Teachers**

in this program are recruited specifically for their ability and desire to meaningfully connect with young, at-risk

Parent Logics Parent Support Group

We are committed to combating the feelings of frustration, helplessness, and uncertainty that can accompany parenting individuals with disabilities. We provide training, resources, and an opportunity for parents to connect, share and vent. We are pleased to continue to partner with Lavelle Hall Smith of MomLogics as part of our monthly Parent Retreat Series.

Accelerated High School Completion

23 area high school districts throughout Southern Cook and Will counties referred over 58 students in 2024 to the iCan Dream Center Accelerated High School Completion Program. For students who have made insufficient progress toward graduation requirements in the traditional high school setting, this program filled the gap by placing students on a path toward graduation and lifelong success. The high school completion program takes a unique approach. Students can receive high school credits and post-secondary services simultaneously, all while addressing barriers and setting students up to achieve success after high school through one of our on-site vocational training programs, our community internship program, or community college. This program offers students all of the supports provided by their school district with additional services that are tailored to the unique needs of the student. In 2024, 100 percent of seniors in this program received their high school diploma from their home school district.

This school has given me a chance to experience new things, become a part of sports, and get excited for my future, something I hadn't had before.







High school was pretty tough for me before coming to the iCan Dream Center. I was bullied and had my share of issues with anger. But this place helped me with all of that and I am becoming a leader and have peace every day here. It is a family here.

TRANSITION PROGRAM

After high school, many students enroll in college. Others go on to jobs. The worst thing that can occur is for students to get lost in a world of idleness, video games, or isolation while they "figure out" the next steps. One thing all 18- 22-year-olds have in common is that they require postsecondary training and opportunities to achieve their dreams. In 2024, ICDC served 38 students referred by 22 high school districts for postsecondary education services. Each student was linked to the services they need along with individualized, therapeutic wraparound supports. Students participating in this program benefited from development of functional skills while also receiving the benefit of paid vocational experience within the community. In addition, all students were provided recreational opportunities to enhance social skills. In 2024, 28 students were placed in community internships at 16 businesses throughout the Tinley Park area. We have over 27 community partners that expand with evolving student interest.

Professional Development

With waiting lists in many of our programs, we recognize that we cannot serve every eligible student in the community. However, we express our commitment to making a positive impact on the community at-large by resourcing schools and teams. iCan Dream Center is a trusted professional development provider for special education teams, school administrators, law enforcement, medical practitioners, and communitybased agencies. In 2024, we provided 14 professional development workshops on the following topics:
